

Saint Wilfrid's Church



In February 1964 the first stones were laid as work began on the construction of a new Roman Catholic Church on the Firs estate, (the original plans were for the church to be built in Hodge Hill on the Coleshill Road). It was to enable Catholics on the Bromford and Firs Estates, Hodge Hill and Castle Bromwich to be able to gather and worship. Prior to then they had gathered in the Primary School which is still on the original site.

The prestigious Birmingham architect Samuel Nathan Cooke drew up the plans for the building. The building is very tall for its period as it stood among twin block towers. The builders, it was said, almost went bankrupt over the project as the foundations for the building go into the earth to the same depth as the church is visible above ground. Originally the church had underground electric heating but as this source of heating increased in price a new heating system had to be installed.

The church has had many Priests coming and going over the years and our current incumbent is Father Johnny Moore. The nature of the Parish community has also changed to reflect the more multicultural nature of society.



In April 1965 the work was completed and we have marked the anniversary with liturgical and social gatherings throughout the year. This concert is our final celebration which brings our community together; the primary school, the church choir, some local home grown talent - Castle Bromwich Singers. It promises to be a wonderful occasion.
